
Nestled between the Coast Mountains and the Pacific Ocean Vancouver is known for its spectacular scenery, natural attractions and diverse people. Inspiring landscapes, wildlife and wilderness are just minutes away from its thriving urban centre rich in culture.











Barely even a town 100 years ago, Canada's west coast gem is today home to two million souls and one of North America's main gateways to the Asia Pacific region. Visitors will find futuristic architecture and a contemporary downtown core contrasting dramatically with a snow-capped mountain backdrop.

Between December and March winter sports are the order of the day, and in February 2010 the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games will be held in Vancouver and nearby Whistler, a mountain resort 125km north of the city.

It all adds up to an endless supply of things to see and do. Here are just some of the attractions we recommend to you during your visit to World Routes 2010.

01 Gastown

This historic district is Vancouver's oldest neighbourhood and still as colourful as ever. A davtime stroll down its cobblestone streets reveals artists' studios, designer shops, First Nations galleries and antique stores.

02 Stanley Park

A glorious natural oasis amidst the bustle of Vancouver, this 1,000-acre park is criss-crossed with trails, filled with attractions and ringed by the famous Seawall, a paved 10km loop offering magnificent mountain, ocean, forest and city views.

03 Robson Street

For a day chock-full of shopping, strolling, dining and people watching, head to Robson Street. This city centre location is a hotbed of high fashion, trendy restaurants and lively bars, and has its own unique coffee-shop culture.

O4 Grouse Mountain

If you're feeling adventurous, go on a tram ride or try hiking up Grouse Mountain - "The Peak of Vancouver" - and you'll be rewarded with some breathtaking panoramic views of the Lower Mainland en route.

05 Granville Island

If you're downtown, hop on one of the small passenger ferries that cruise through False Creek to Granville Island, famous for its year-round indoor farmer's market, boutique micro-brewery, street buskers, artisan studios and live theatre.
