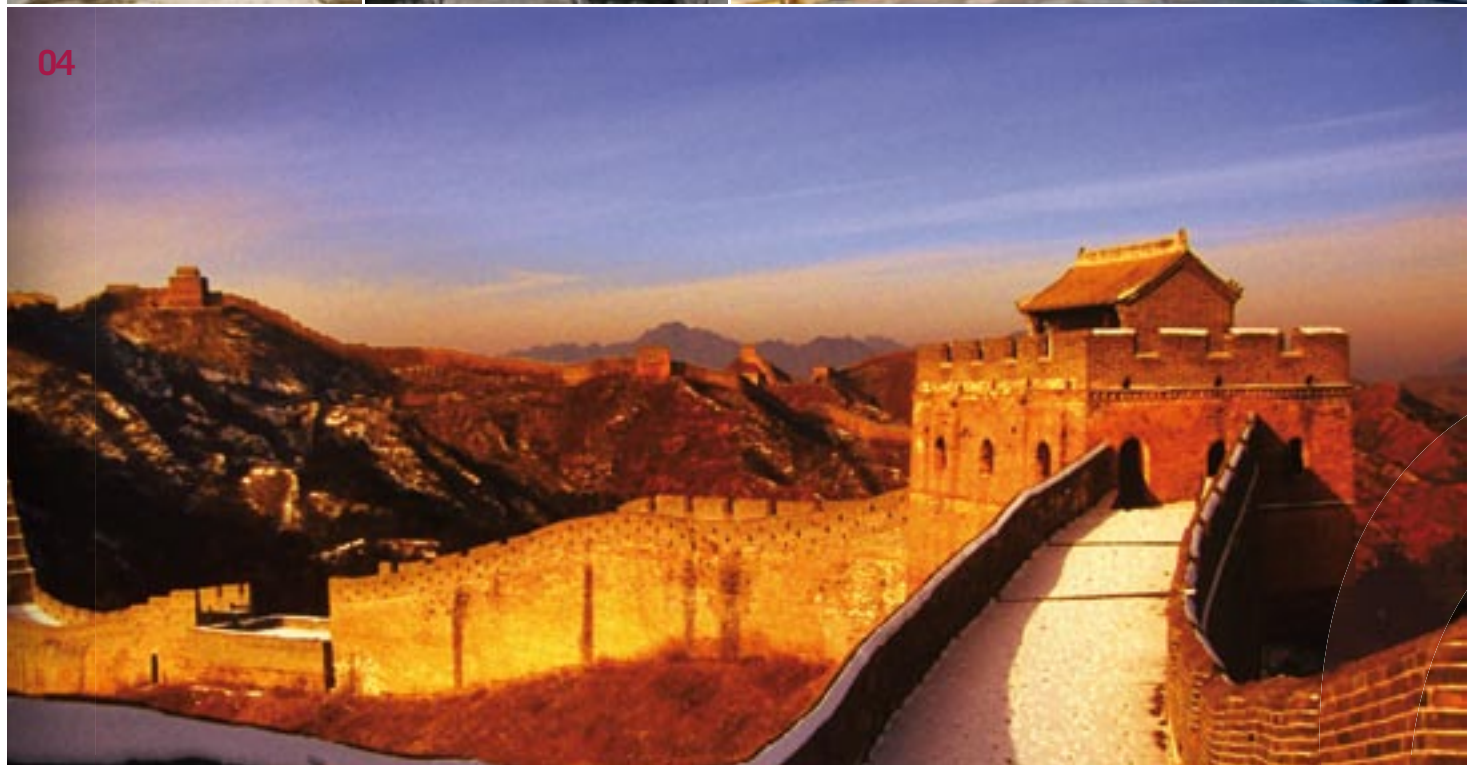
Beijing

'He who has not climbed the Great Wall is not a true man' proclaimed Chairman Mao and a walk along this magnificent feat of human endeavour is a must on any visit to China. The fortified sections at Badaling and Mutianyu are within easy reach of Beijing and make for an unforgettable day out.

The city's major shopping street, Wangfujing, is an essential stop on any visit. By day it is a veritable treasure trove of shops and malls, by night framed by a maze of side streets filled with tempting traditional food stalls.

Beijing plays host to a breathtaking selection of restaurants serving delicious banquets from all corners of the world. However, Beijing is, of course, the place to sample Peking Duck, a legendary delicacy!

The intrepid 14th Century explorer Marco Polo once described Beijing as a 'vast ancient city of great splendour, magnificent palaces, stately gardens and broad avenues.' Hopefully, you'll be able to take a little break from proceedings and explore its many delights for yourself.



01 Ming Tombs

The Ming Tombs are located about 30 miles northwest of Beijing at the foot of the Tianshou Mountains. Located here are the tombs of 13 of the 16 Ming Dynasty emperors. Dragon Hill lies to the east and Crouching Tiger Hill to the west.

02 Tian'anmen square

Located at the centre of Beijing City is Tian'anmen Square, where you can visit Tian'anmen Tower, Monument to the People's Heroes, the Great Hall of the People, Mao Zedong Memorial Hall and see the national flag raising ceremony.

03 The Forbidden City

Lying at the centre of Beijing, the Forbidden City, called Gu Gong in Chinese, was the imperial palace during the Ming and Qing dynasties. Now known as the Palace Museum, it is to the north of Tiananmen Square. It is the world's largest palace complex and covers 74 hectares.

04 The Great Wall Of China

The Great Wall of China is over 4,000 miles long and is one of the greatest wonders of the world. The Great Wall stretches across deserts, grasslands, mountains and plateaus from the east to the west of China.

05 The National Theatre

The National Centre for the Performing Arts or National Grand Theatre is colloquially described as The Egg, is another unique building of architectural significance and one not to missed when visiting Beijing.

06 Summer Palace

The Summer Palace is the largest and best-preserved imperial garden in China. Its Chinese name, YiHeYuan, translates as 'Garden of Nurtured Harmony' or 'Garden for Maintaining Health and Harmony'. It is located on the western edge of Beijing, 12km from central Beijing.

07 The Birds Nest

The spectacular National Stadium or Bird's Nest has been hailed as the finest arena in the world and was the centrepiece to the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games. The stadium was designed by award-winning Swiss firm Herzog and de Meuron and Chinese architect Li Xinggang.

08 Temple of Heaven

The Temple of Heaven is a worthwhile visiting place in Beijing. It is much bigger than the Forbidden City and smaller than the Summer Palace with an area of about 2,700,000 square meters. The Temple was built in 1420 A.D. during the Ming Dynasty to offer sacrifice to Heaven.

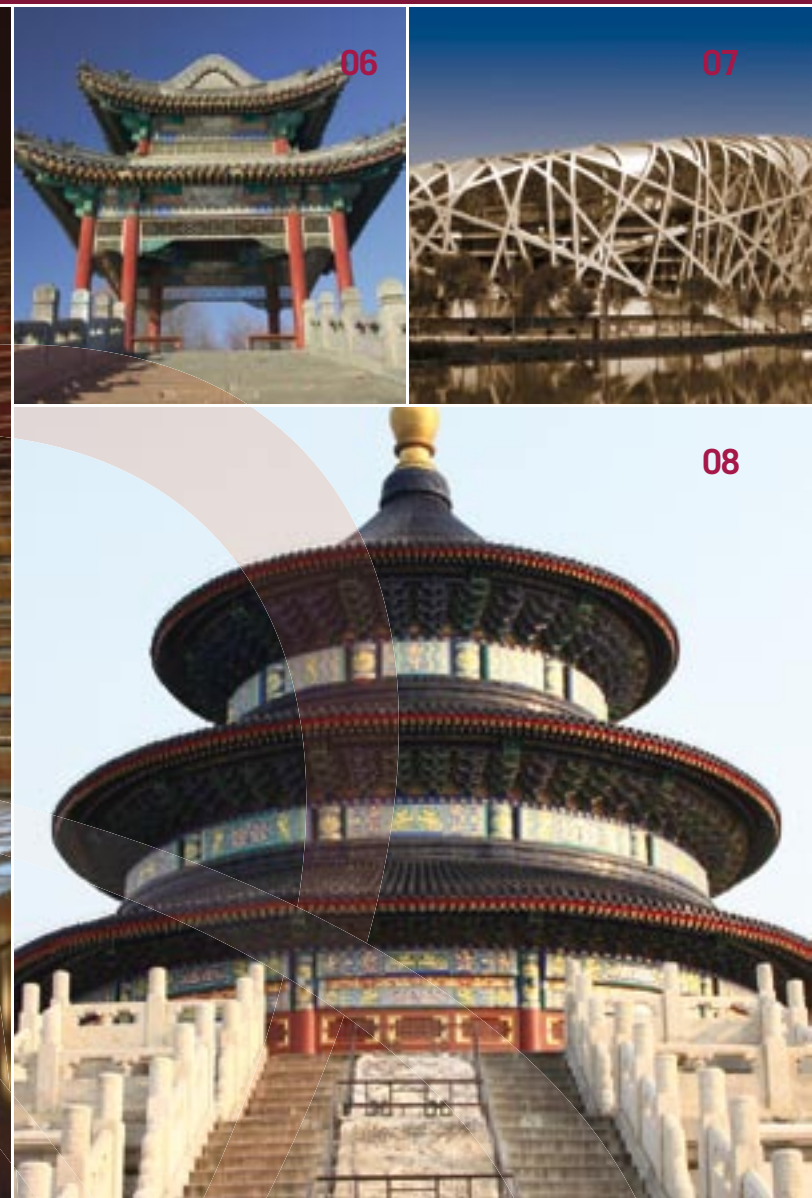

Recommended hotels

Located in the central business district, this 5-star hotel in Beijing is part of the China Central Place, an awe-inspiring complex featuring offices, shopping and residential towers and just, 30-40 minutes from the event venue.

Hilton Beijing ★★★★★

This excellent hotel is located in the Chaoyang business district and is located approx 30-40 minutes from the event venue.

This 5-star hotel, the Kempinski Hotel Beijing Lufthansa Center represents the ideal blend of eastern and western and is located approx 30-40 minutes from the event venue.
